GENERAL REGULATIONS

- 1 Gate entry prices: Adults \$15 Children 16 and under free. Individual area catalogues free apart from the Horse Section: \$2 and full catalogue \$3. Available from the office.
- 2 Times:
 - Horse sections commence at 8:30 am.
 - All other stock to be on the grounds by 9:30 am.
 - All produce, machinery and stalls to be staged by 9:30 am.
 - Produce Shed closes at 9.45am sharp for judging. Exhibits must be staged by this time or will miss out.
 - No stock, produce, machinery or stalls to be removed from the grounds before 4:00 pm unless prior permission has been granted by the Secretary or the Head Marshal of the Section concerned.
- 3 PARADE OF PRIZE STOCK will be held prior to the Machinery Parade.
- 4 No person under 16 may lead a large animal.
- 5 All prize winners in the Horse Section MUST PARADE. Cattle Section optional.
- 6 Only Ribbons won on the day of the Show are to be displayed.

- 7 Entries and their associated fees must be in the hands of the Secretary on or before the closing dates in the schedule. If your class entry fees sum to \$10.00 or more and you are not a member you will receive one Courtenay A & P Show gate pass (this does not apply to individual exhibitors on the entry form).
- 8 The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 9 All stock must be the bona fide property of the Exhibitor or family living at home and (other than prime stock) must have been in his/her possession at least one month before date of Show. Prime stock – three months.
- 10 The owner of the dam of an animal at the time of mating shall be considered the breeder.
- 11 Exhibitors will be required to state as accurately as possible the known age of all stock where age is specified.
- 12 District Exhibitors must reside in the district between the Rakaia and Waimakariri Rivers, and west of the Main South, Dawsons and Chattertons Roads.
- 13 PRIZES: In all cases where two or more Prizes have been awarded, the Judges are directed to commend or highly commend the other exhibits worthy of distinction.
- 14 No third prize money will be paid in any class unless there are five or more entries (except for children's classes in the Produce Shed).
- 15 In all cases where the Judges consider there is want of merit in any particular class, they shall be empowered to award Second prize only in lieu of First.
- 16 Judges of stock are directed not to give undue weight to high condition (except in Classes of Prime Stock) but to award the prizes to animals in each Class which they consider best represent the particular breed or description intended to be encouraged.
- 17 Good manners, etiquette and sportsmanship is expected at all times. Rudeness or offensive behaviour can result in disqualification, disciplinary action and/or removal from the grounds.
- 18 The Committee reserves the right to substitute trophies and/or vouchers in lieu of cash prizes, should offers come to hand after issuing the Schedule.
- 19 In the case of unforeseen circumstances preventing the revenue amounting to the expected sum, prizes will be paid in proportion to the revenue received.
- 20 Prizes must be claimed by 15th December following the Show.
- 21 Points for trophies count as follows:

First prize:	3 points
Second prize:	2 points
Third prize:	1 point
- 22 In the event of a tie for a trophy or cup, the winner of the largest number of firsts shall have preference and if still a tie, seconds shall then take preference and so forth.
- 23 Protests must be delivered to the Secretary in writing accompanied by a fee of \$50 within an hour of the exhibits being judged and awards distributed. The decision of the Protest Committee shall be final. The fee will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.
- 24 The Committee will not, under any circumstances, hold themselves responsible for loss, damage or mis-delivery of stock, produce or machinery exhibited at the Show.
- 25 DOGS must be under control and leashed at all times unless participating in an authorised event.
- 26 Any Exhibitor infringing any of the above regulations shall be subject to be dealt with as may be decided by the Committee, whose decision shall be final.
- 27 **Warning** - Whilst every reasonable safety precaution is taken, competitors and visitors to the grounds are hereby notified that the Committee and members of the Courtenay A & P Association along with show volunteers, accept no responsibility

for injuries or damage sustained at any time on or about the Show-grounds from any cause.

- 28 Visitors are asked to report any Health and Safety issues to the Secretary's office as soon as possible.
- 29 Eftpos facilities available on grounds at Secretary's Office.

SHEEP

Judging starts at 10am

- * No Sheep allowed to compete in more than one class.
- * All sheep entered in purebred classes must be entered in, or be eligible for entry in their respective flock books.
- * Sheep to be shown in wool, unless otherwise stipulated.
- * With the exception of Prime Sheep and where otherwise stated, no sheep shown in wool classes shall have been shorn earlier than 20th July in the year prior to the Show, and sheep in shorn classes shall have been shorn since 20th July in the year of the Show. Black and coloured shorn classes shall have been shorn since 20th May in the year of the Show.
- * Imported sheep, ineligible through shearing regulations, may be shorn, and a prize awarded, if the Judges certify, to sufficient merit.
- * If in the opinion of the Committee of no less than three members, any sheep that has been rightly disqualified for being unfairly shorn, such sheep will be branded and disqualified for life.
- * All wet Ewes to be shown with their lambs, and in all purebred classes, lambs must be of the same as the Ewe.
- * Under the existing Stock Act, any sheep showing bloom dip or artificial colouring will be disqualified.
- * The Association has the right to have lousy or diseased stock removed from the grounds.

NATURAL CONDITION. In all natural condition classes:

1. Sheep must be close and evenly shorn.
2. The wool must not be trimmed in any way since shearing, other than crutching or dagging.
3. There must not be any colouring, oiling, or locking except Autumn dipping.
4. The sheep must not have been housed, rugged or covered at any time or in any way.

A NAIT approved RFID tag will be mandatory for all movements of cattle, including day old calves.

Please do not remove tags if cattle are identified with AHB or Minda tags. As of 1st July 2012 a secondary tag is no longer required under the new NAIT scheme.

It is the livestock exhibitors responsibility to record all animal movements with NAIT 48 hours prior to leaving the farm/property for the show and then within 48 hours of returning to the farm / property from the show.

PLEASE NOTE: Courtenay A & P is no longer affiliated with the RAS, therefore a win in an Open, Novice or Paced and Mannered Class will not be signed off on Life or Annual Height Certificates.

CLEAN SPORT - our show runs under clean sport rules. Forbidden substance is any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse or pony by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show and that testing of all animals is at the person responsible's risk. Your entry into the Show denotes acceptance of these conditions.

ARREARS - No person who is in arrears with regard to entry fees, subscriptions, or any other show/event charge is eligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

CONDUCT - Inappropriate behaviour towards show officials, Judges and fellow competitors, or any other third party connected with the show is unacceptable. Offenders will be removed from the grounds.

- The Committee reserves the right to object to and /or remove from the grounds any person being heavy handed or harsh to a horse or pony.
- The Members in Attendance may remove any horse or pony from the ring, if in their opinion, it is a danger to other competitors.
- **No** prizes to be awarded if the Judge considers the horse unsound. Judges are directed to award prizes only to animals, which they consider free from hereditary unsoundness.

STALLIONS AND COLTS - Please note stallions are permitted in Hunter Jumping. All other classes to be mare or gelding, unless stallion has prior approval by Horse Convenor in writing.

- All stallions and colts (with the exception of Miniature horses, foals and Shetland yearlings) must be shown in a bit.
- A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.
- It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz vest at Shows/Events when outside the showing ring.

GENERAL RULES

- Names of horses to be given. In stating age of horse the year to count from 1st August.
- All riders ages are as at 1st August. Open pony exhibits must be ridden by riders under seventeen years of age.
- In all classes where height is specified an annual or life height certificate are acceptable or a day measure from our show. 5mm will be allowed for shoes.

- Refunds: 75% refund upon production of a medical or veterinary certificate. Substitutions accepted – contact Secretary.
- Courtenay A&P reserves the right to combine classes if there are insufficient entries.
- All Hackneys, Non Hackneys, Pleasure Harness Horse & Pony and Miniature Horses in harness are invited to parade just prior to the Horse Parade.
- Competitors may be disqualified if not ready when called. Consideration cannot be given to riders where judging times in different groups conflict. Entering in different sections is at your own risk.

DEFINITION OF NOVICE

- A Novice exhibit or rider, is one that has yet to win six (6) classes in any division within the competitions provided at any A & P Show/Event. Once you have achieved six wins in Confirmation (and this includes Lady's and Gent's classes) and /or Paced and Mannered classes, you can no longer enter in Novice classes in that category.
- Novice wins to be counted at time of Show.
- If Horse/Pony is upgraded, entry to another class is permitted or entry fee can be reclaimed. Inquiries to the Secretary.
- Novice Horse & Ponies to be shown in **snaffle bits** only.
- Novice may enter open classes.
- As District Classes are restricted they do not count as an Open or Novice win. A win in a district/novice (no wins) does not count for an Open or Novice Class win
